



WABC Scholarship Goes to Local Student Entering U-Md.

Maryland in Top Five for Construction Employment

Construction employment improved nationally in July, with Maryland coming in fourth in the nation for lowest unemployment in construction. Only Wyoming, North Dakota and South Dakota had lower construction unemployment rates, according to figures released by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Recent hiring jumped Maryland to fourth place from its 11th place finish in June. West Virginia had the highest construction unemployment rate in both June and July.

Maryland's July unemployment rate for construction was 2.1 percent, a significant improvement over June's 3.5 percent and the 4.8 percent registered a year ago in July 2014. Wyoming had the lowest construction unemployment rate in the nation with 1.3 percent in July, while West Virginia was highest at 8.4 percent.

Court Decision Opens Superblock Development

Long stalled development of the so-called Superblock site in the city's downtown west side is underway following a recent court decision. The Baltimore Development Corp. is seeking new proposals for the parcel bounded by Fayette, Lexington and Howard Streets and Park Avenue.

In 2013, Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake canceled a 2005 deal with Lexington Square Partners. The developer sued the city, losing its case in May 2014. Two appeals courts decisions earlier this year and again in August upheld the ruling in favor of the city, opening the way for new development. Another suit filed by Orioles owner Peter G. Angelos was dismissed in 2012.
